the authors' "Encouraging the Heart" style of leadership. They are bright, responsive, caring and creative. They embraced fun. Generous to their core, they gave their time, their money and their energy.

The 80 class members really got to know each other, enjoying a personal and professional interest in their classmates as they engaged in their leadership work. Extremely social, this was a class willing to take risks, going deep into their learning. They weren't afraid to speak up, to reveal more of themselves and to be truly authentic and genuine with each other.

It started when class member Anh Nguyen personally invited each classmate to gather for intimate dinners around the region. This camaraderie continued as the class interviewed local leaders in our region and worked on projects to help 10 local nonprofits focused on children, the arts and the environment.

It culminated with Chad Yoshinobu's rousing and emotional closing speech at the graduation celebration. Reflecting on the lessons learned from his classmates, Yoshinobu said: "This individual teaches you something new and that something new is usually a lesson about yourself and your current way of thinking. Along the way these things allow us to connect. Once you connect you build trust and once you build trust, then and only then can you start to lead."

Many class members have already stepped up to be LT's next leaders, coaching the 2011 lab teams and joining the alumni leadership and curriculum committees. They continue to meet as a group, well after graduation.

As Kouzes and Posner say, "Leaders encourage the heart of their constituents to carry on. Genuine acts of caring can uplift the spirit

and draw people forward. It's part of the leader's job to show people that they can win. Leaders make sure people benefit when behavior is aligned with cherished values."

CLASS OF 2010 Encouraging the heart

The Class of 2010 – representing business, nonprofits and the public sector – was the most diverse group of any LT class. Some 36 percent were people of color – Asian Pacific Islander, African American, Latino/Hispanic, Native American and biracial. Participants ranged in age from 26 to 52, representing three generations of leaders operating together - Baby Boomers, Gen X and Gen Y. They included emerging and existing leaders from King, Snohomish and Pierce counties.

The Class of 2010 chose to help 10 local organizations with projects ranging from promoting walkable communities to helping African American middle and high school youth prepare for college. The organizations served included Feet First, Bicycle Alliance of Washington, YMCA Black Achievers, Broadway Bound, Powerful Schools, Rainier Scholars, Seattle Theatre Group, Youth Venture Seattle, Garfield High School Congress of Racial Equality Cultural Relations Program (CORE) and the Municipal League.


